


All Linux is not created equal.

This survey asks respondents to report:

- What version of Linux are you running, and for what IT initiatives?
- What are your biggest challenges with your current Linux environment?
- What do you need from your Linux vendor that you're not receiving?


What version of Linux are you running?



Nearly two thirds of all respondents to the survey (65%) report they are running Red Hat Linux, either alone or in conjunction with other versions of Linux.




What IT initiatives are you using or will you use Linux for?



Most respondents use Linux in cloud or database initiatives.



How do you currently support Linux?




Respondents report they support Linux with a combination of on-staff experts and outside support resources. These may include community based, paid commercial, OS included, and/or outsourced/managed support.




How satisfied are you with your current version of Linux?

(Rate 1 to 5: 1= not at all satisfied, 5 = highly satisfied)






What are your biggest challenges with your current Linux environment?




Most respondents (63%) cite maintaining staff skills as a problem. 42% are challenged by patching and updating. Other significant problems: determining and following a roadmap and maintaining security (24% each), and Linux support (23%).



Does your Linux distribution come with a dedicated product security team that monitors, identifies, and addresses risks to your data?



What do you need from your Linux vendor that you're not receiving?



Respondents list a number of shortcomings in their Linux vendors, most notably a lack of 24/7 access to support engineers (40%).



Do you have plans to make a change in the version of Linux you're currently using?



21% of those surveyed are definitely committed to change their version of Linux within a year. The remaining 79% do not rule out switching Linux versions as long as there is clear value demonstrated.
